It is the jaw-dropping story of her father's infamous life as a Miami undercover narcotics agent-turned-drug smuggler. Her third book, *A Perfectly Good Fantasy: A Memoir*, is the darkly funny sequel to *Midnight Calling* and shines some humor on how we can use just about *anything*—booze, relationships, even potato chips—to try to change the way we feel.
